In 1968 Paul Ehrlich, author of "The Population Bomb", predicted that

"The battle to feed all humanity is over... hundreds of millions of people will starve to death in 1970s and 1980s".





In January 1970, Life Magazine wrote:

"... by 1985 air pollution will have reduced the amount of sunlight reaching earth by one-half".

American Ecologist Kenneth Watt said in 1970:
